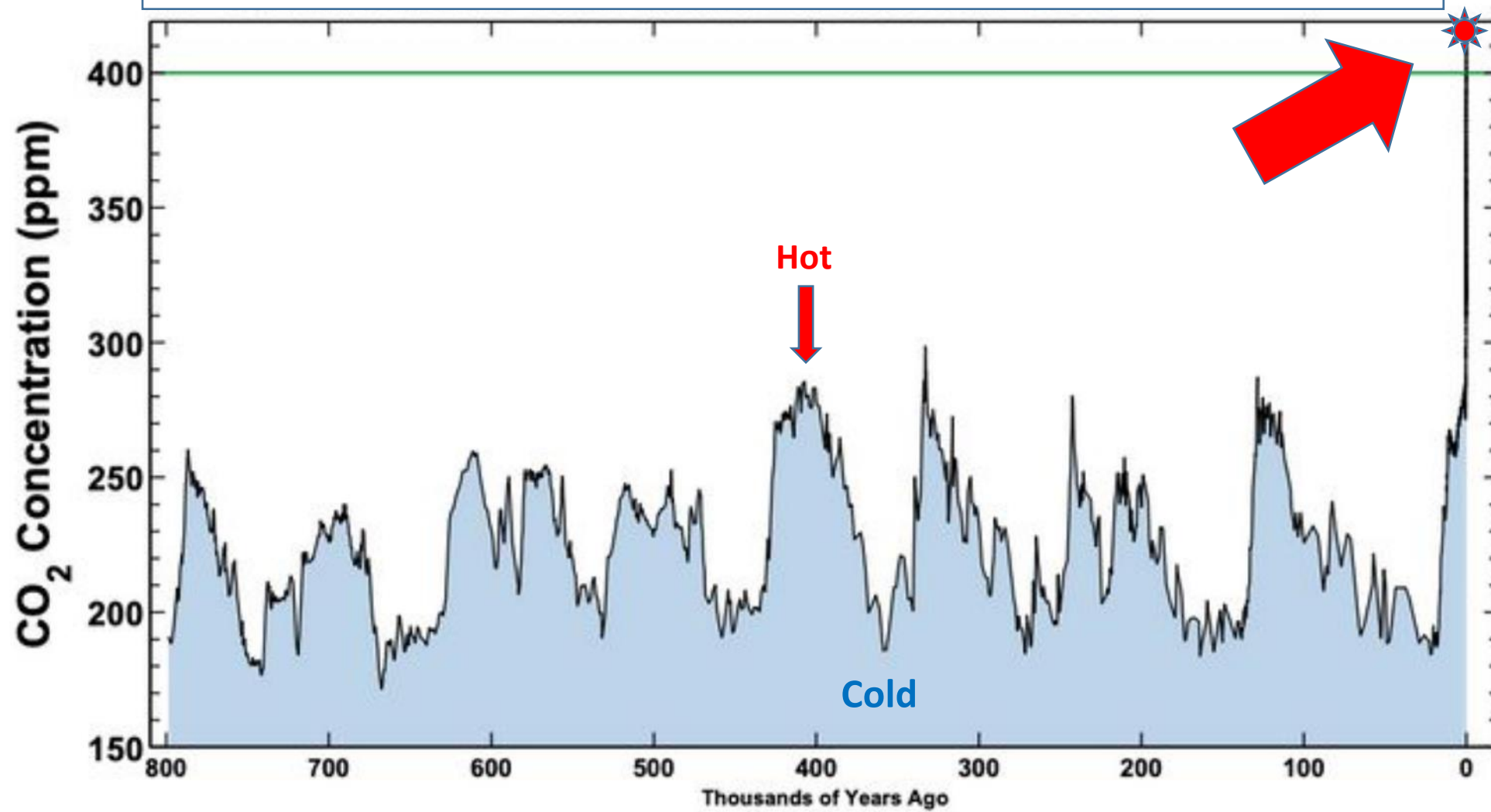
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CO₂ variation between ice ages

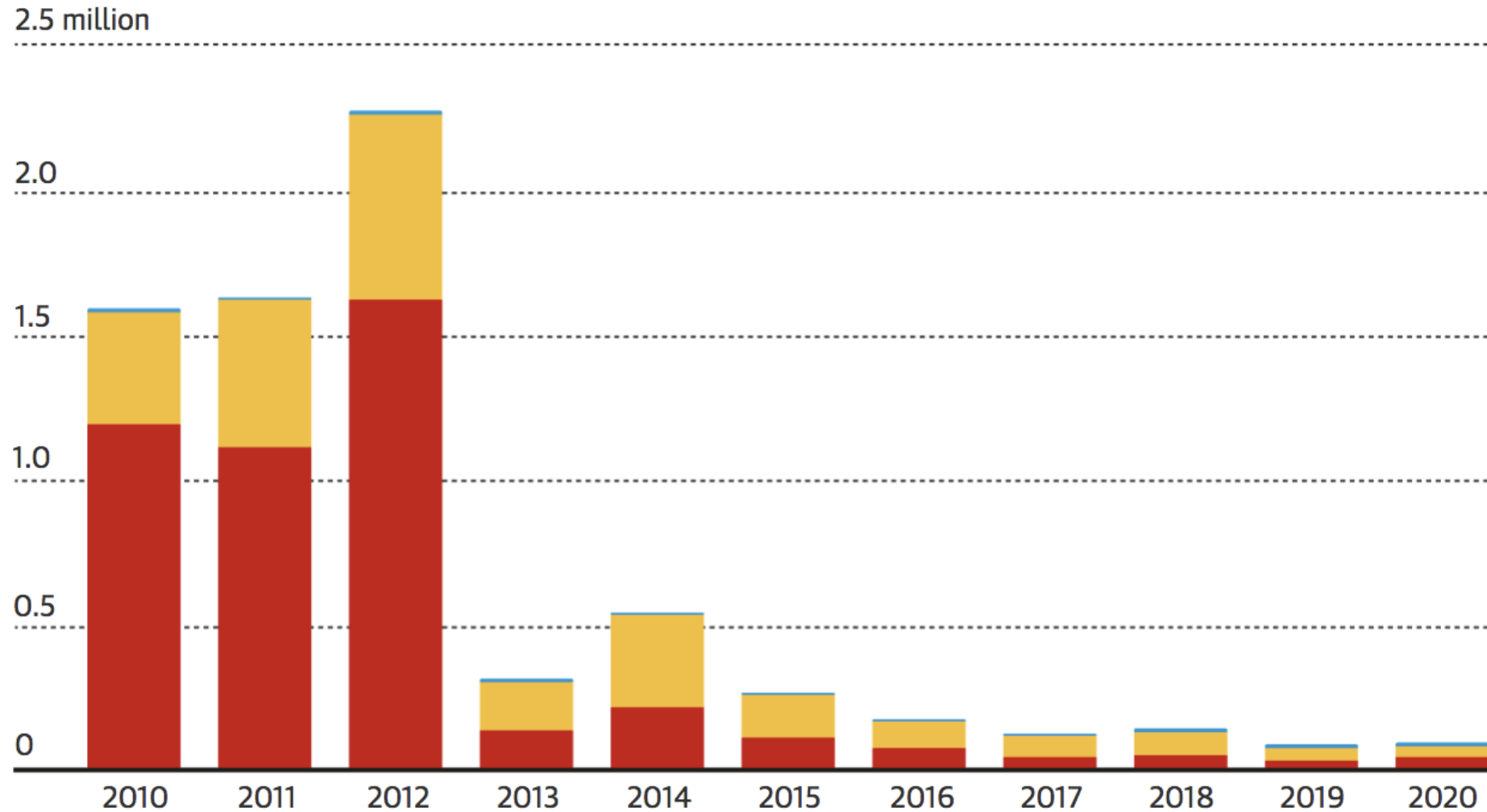

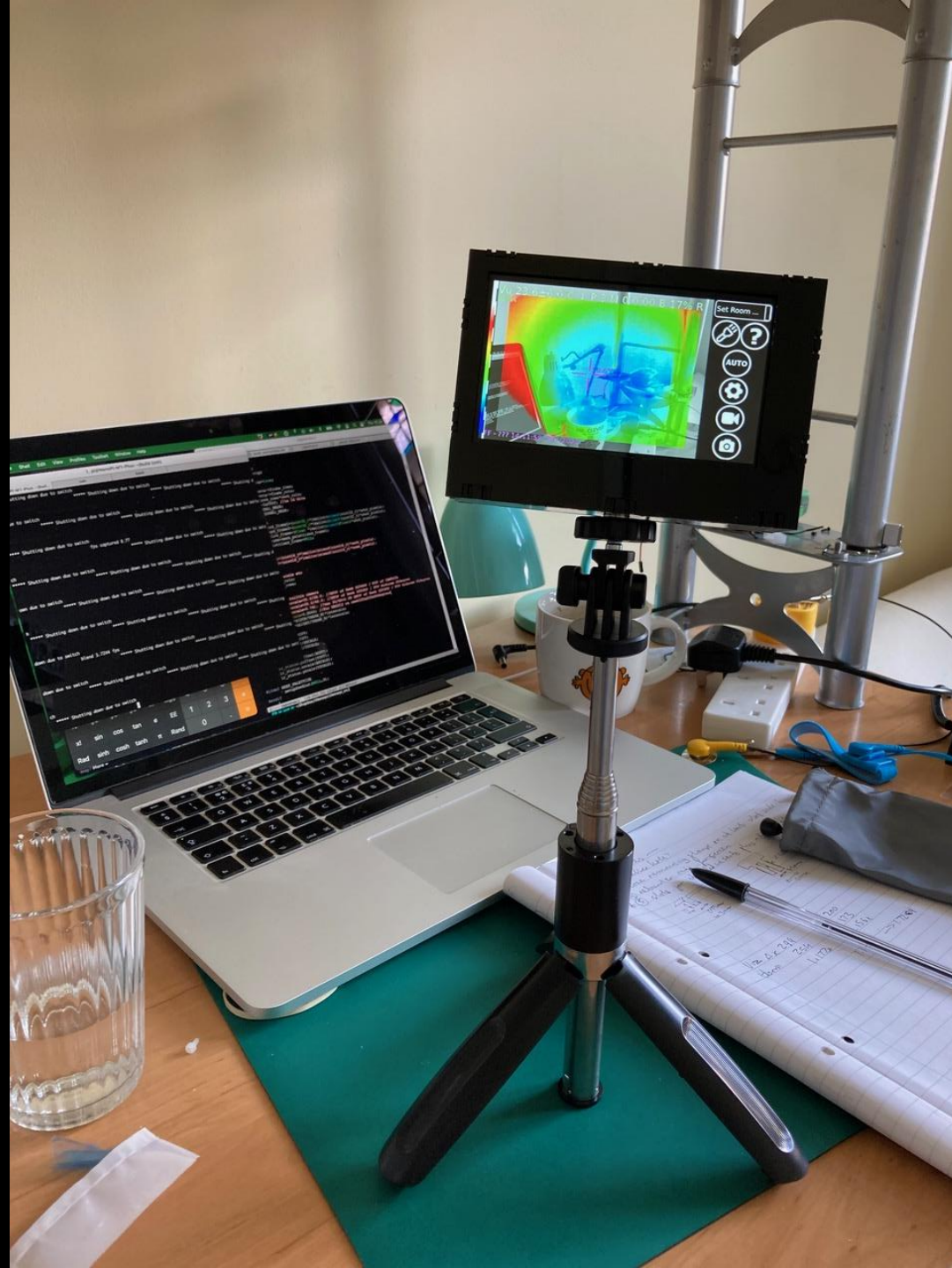
Heat Loss in Old Homes

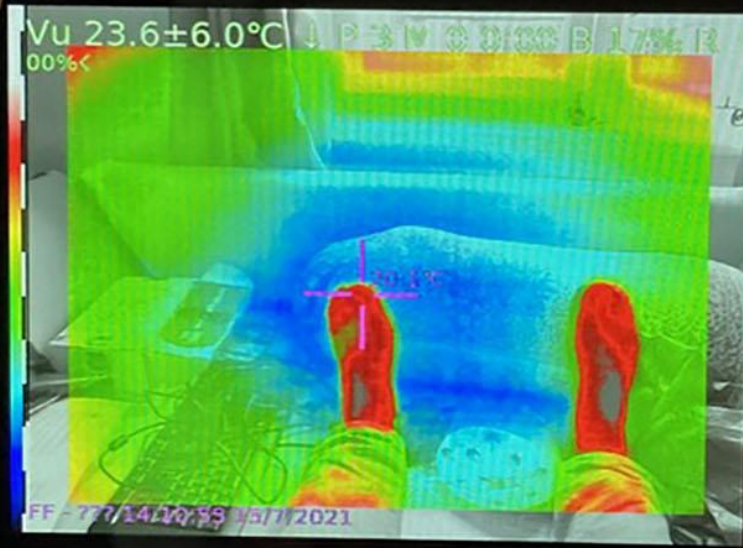

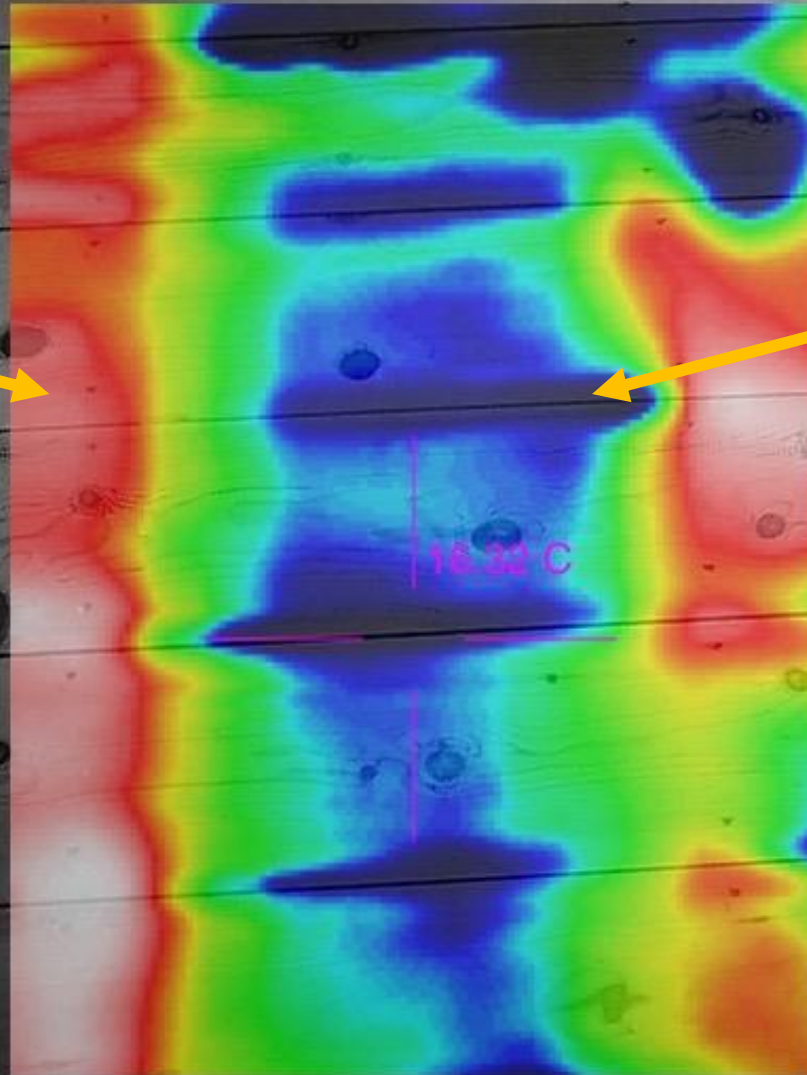






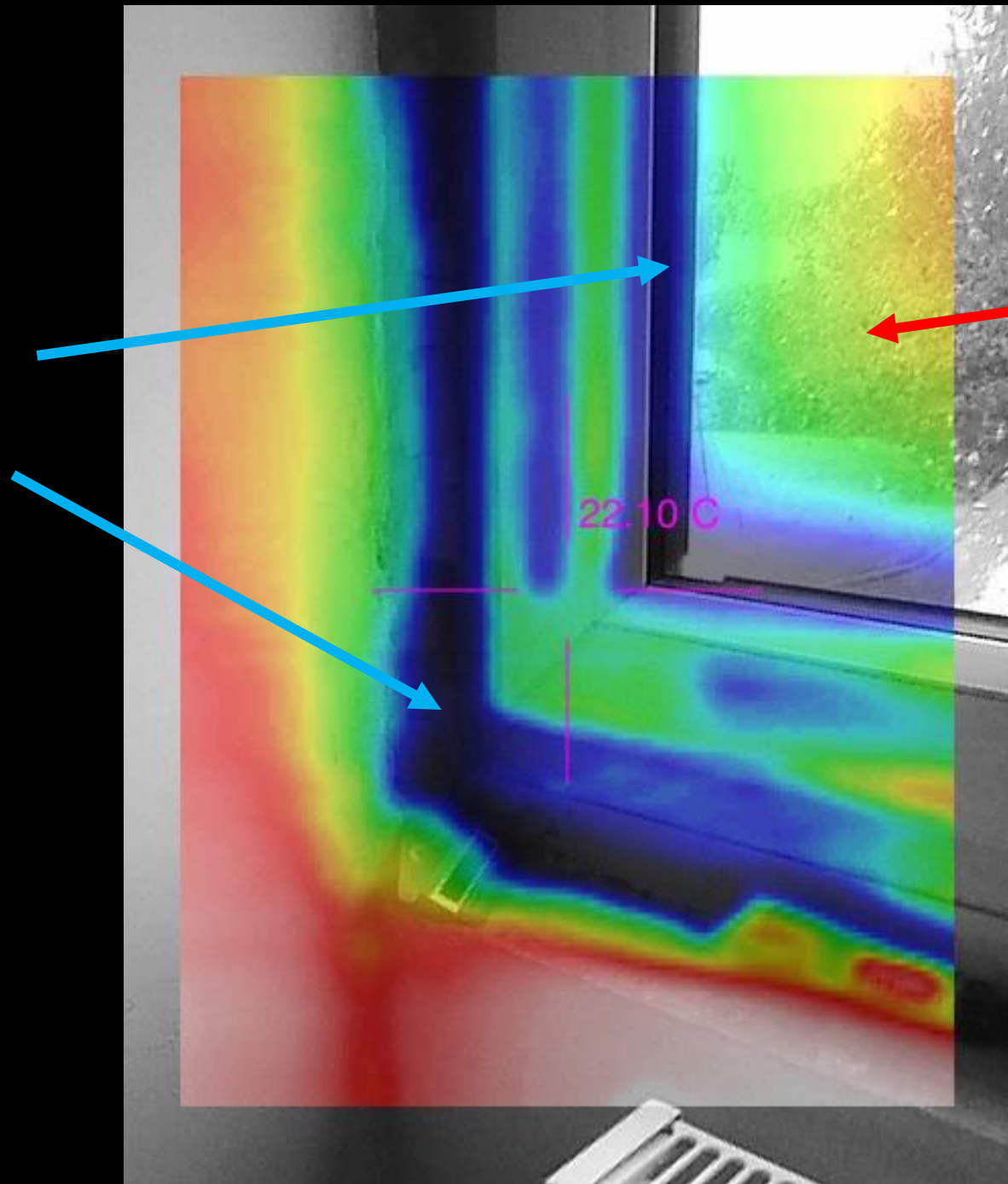
Hot underfloor pipe

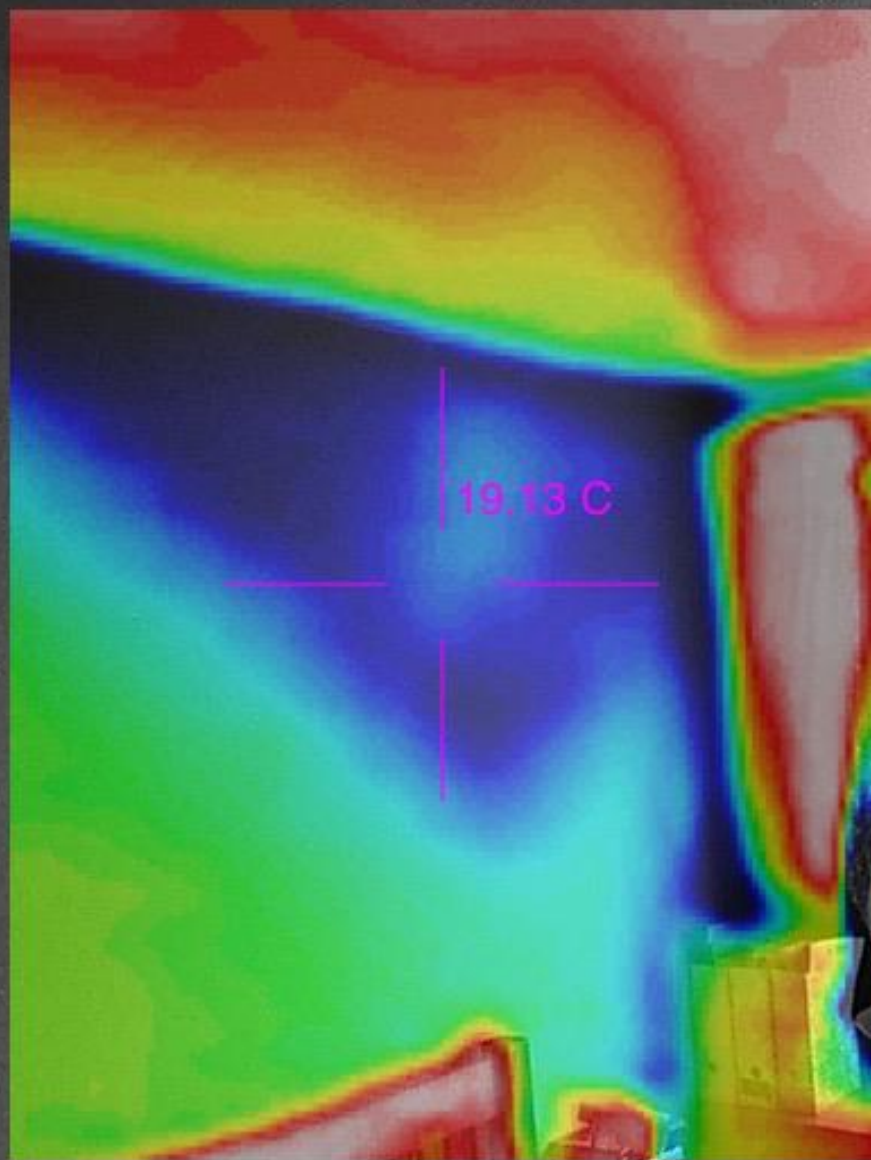

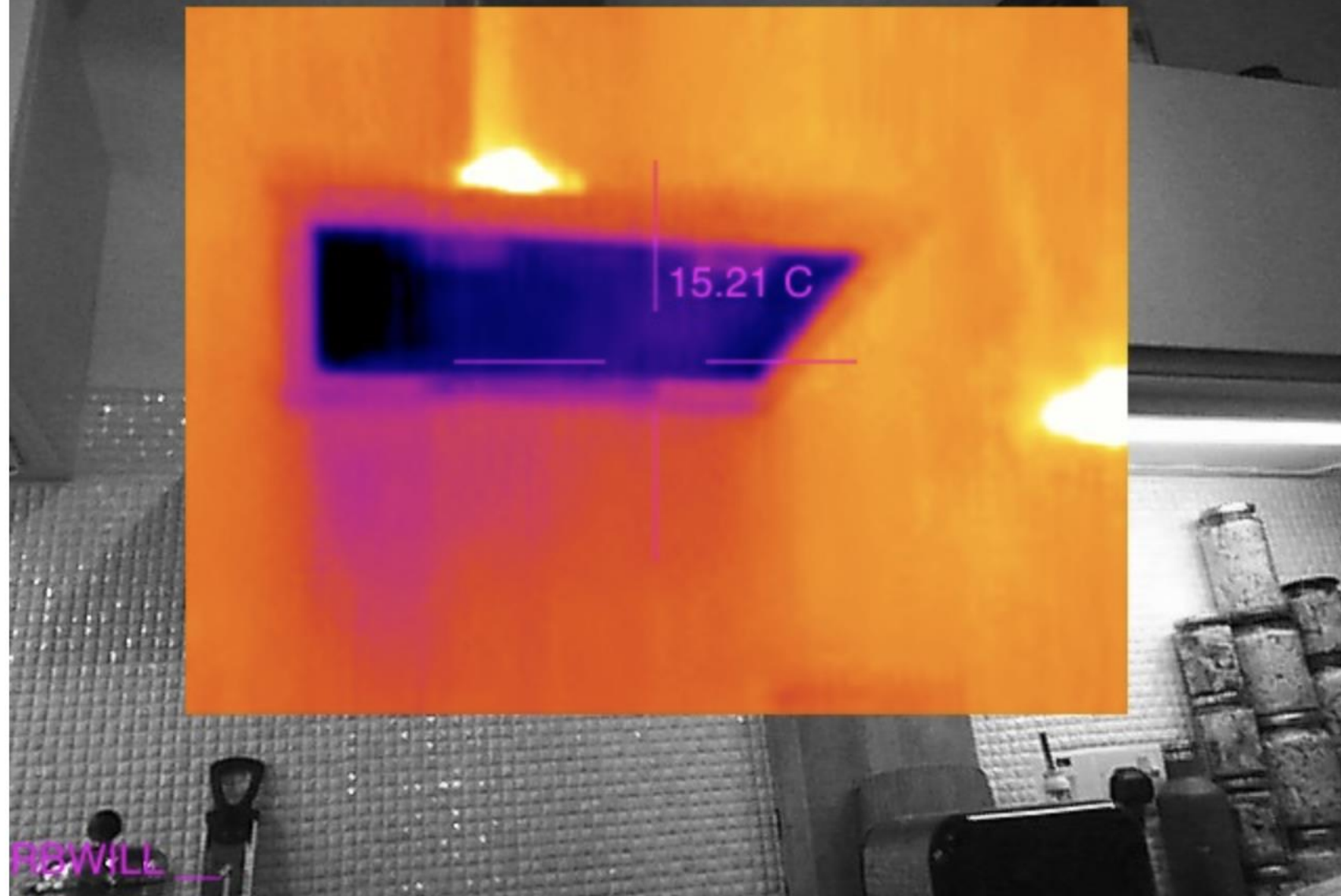

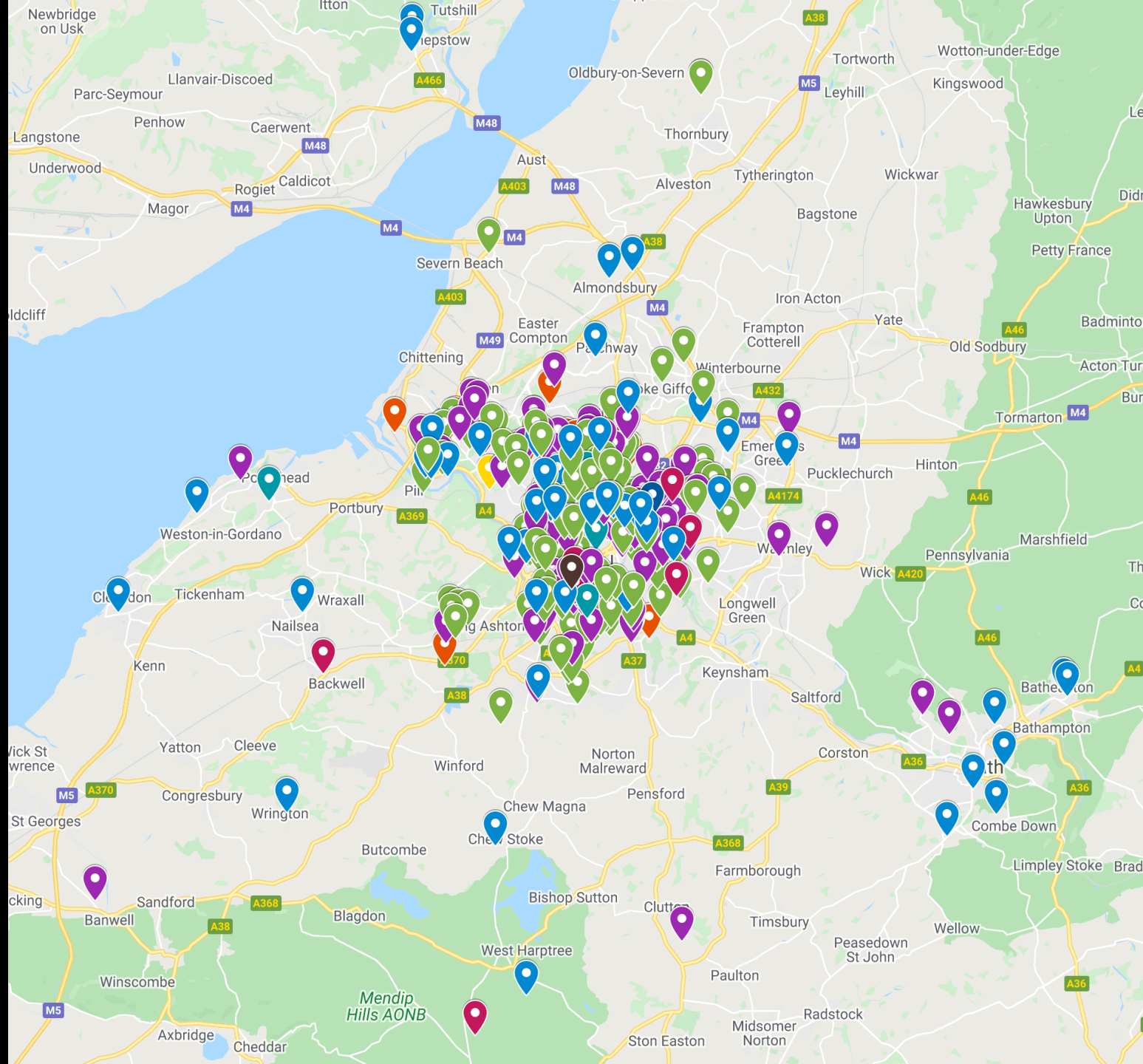

OUTCOMES – analysed by University of Bristol

- Results
- 66% of residents take low-cost remedial action within 1 month of survey.
- 87% complete remedial action within 1 year.
- Remedial action is by stages – the easy, cheap, jobs get done first.
- With fuel bills, temperature and airflow we can verify fuel and carbon savings.

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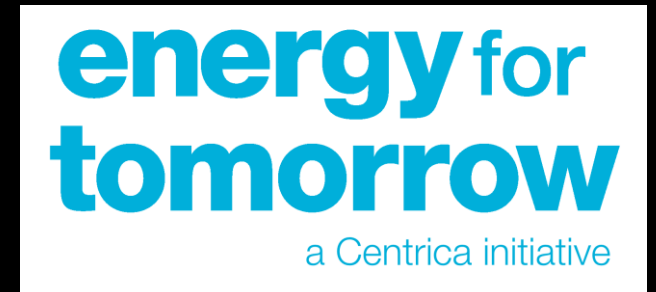

HGV lorries on Wells Road

At Bristol City Council Members Forum tonight, Cllr Ed Plowden referred to research by Anne and Angela in relation to HGVs on Wells Road.

Question: Local residents are concerned about the safety of these vehicles passing through a residential area.. What are the possible options to mitigate this issue?

Response: The A37 is a key regional A Road that links the South Coast to Bristol and beyond and always has been. There are limited options for HGVs coming from that area to reach the strategic road network. The A37 is a key radial route serving south Bristol and as such is an acceptable route for HGV movements. Options to remove these movements would require road building elsewhere to provide alternative links such as to the ring road. I don't understand what you think has changed.

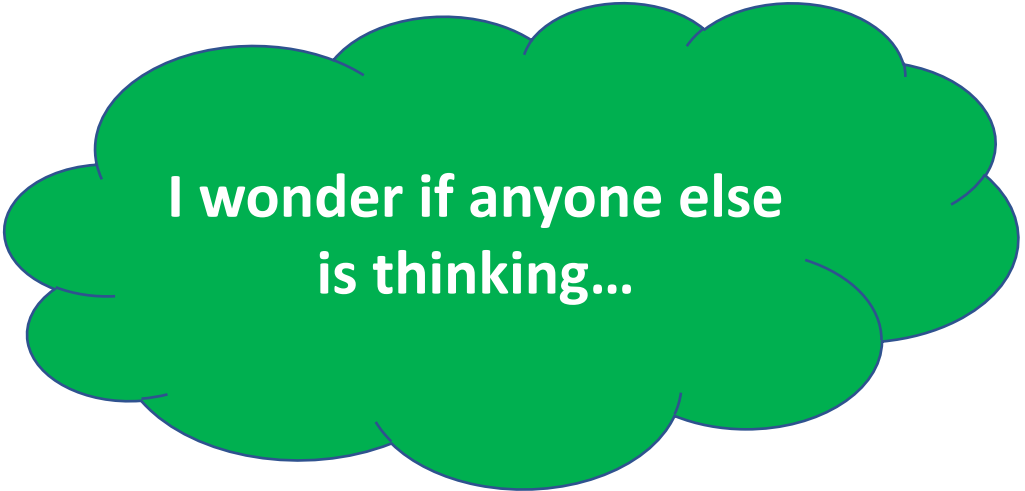
